I lived a lie for so long (basically to protect my future and my family) that I eventually grew very comfortable choosing whoever it is that I wanted to be. Instead of going out with friends on the weekends; I have spent so much time watching movies that I would dream of being able to meet such interesting people. I fought, I overcame and I solved the problem. That first side of me however, has never left.

Recently, I was waived into SAG AFTRA by choosing to compete with Union Actors, and beating odds in a Series called "The Harlem Knights", we're projecting it to do very well this Pilot season. I was casted as the male face for an Anti-Bullying campaign in New Jersey which will translate to New York; what makes it that great to me is the awareness of a major problem and I'm proud for major schools to see this video. I was casted for a promotional video part of the Annie feature as a singer and a basketball player to portray myself as being multi-talented. I also graduated from a top New York acting program called BIH Studios as an Advanced Actor and was admitted to a senior level public speaking course as a freshman while attending St. John's University. I seek representation with your agency; I am 100% ready to give 100%. I am fully available and can't wait to hear from you. I promise to be something that you've never seen.
